


AN EXHIBIT OF SUMMER SCHOOL WORKSHOPS

The first-of-its-kind climate tech lab will enable studying the practical-oriented aspects of climate change. Students pursuing B.Tech. in Climate Change and the Anant Fellowship for Climate Action will learn to run simulations and build technological solutions for mitigating or adapting to climate change at the lab.


