



## CRAFTSMEN TURN FACULTY AT ANANTU

The university celebrated India's rich crafts heritage by inviting award-winning artists and craftsmen from different parts of India to train more than 400 design students in indigenous crafts. AnantU hosted eleven craftsmen from Kashmir, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Gujarat, Telangana and Chhattisgarh, who have championed handicrafts and vernacular design narratives. The students interacted with artisans and learnt details of the craft and materials used to create unique artefacts. The course is an initiative of INDIC (Indian designs and Innovative Crafts), recently launched centre to introduce students to the merits of traditional practices, weave their learnings with technical knowledge of design and create innovative yet sustainable designs.

**Common Studio Exhibit:** Students showcased their creations representing different traditional crafts of India like bamboo work, glasswork, wood inlay, miniatures, Kashmiri papier mache, dhokra casting, silver filigree and jewellery made of brass in a recently organised exhibition at AnantU campus. These creations were conceptualised and given a concrete form during the hands-on learning workshops with celebrated and expert artisans across India.
