



FACULTY STRENGTHENS RESEARCH CULTURE AT ANANTU

Mentored by Prof. Bhaskar Bhatt and Prof. Parth Raval, the healthcare product comes with in-built acupuncture points and uses magnets and a velcro strap for added customisation and comfort. The idea is to relieve knee joint pain by stimulating specific pressure points, thereby improving the blood flow.

Design students, as part of their common studios, learnt to create e-textile products, modern renditions of traditional toys, photo montage books, soundscapes and educational tools, among others.
