

Currently a first-year student, she is on full need-based financial aid.

'I come from a village where agriculture is the primary source of income. My family of 19 is engaged in the production of cotton and dates. Changing weather patterns and crop cycles have significantly impacted agricultural yields in my village. Anant's BTech programme will help me bring change and ease my family's burden', she explains.

Driven and ambitious, Pallavi shares her aspirations to reduce the impact of intensive agricultural practices on the environment, highlighting how Anant is instrumental in helping her achieve these goals.

'Both faculty and fellow students have been a constant source of support, aiding me with settling-in and acquiring a range of skills. Be it through presentations or group projects, I have started to feel more confident in my interpersonal skills. Anant has enabled me to recognise my potential by exposing me to lessons and experiences from various subjects and places around the world', she adds.

Urvashi Butalia is an Indian feminist activist, researcher, publisher and writer. Known for her insightful commentary on issues related to gender, identity and history, Urvashi conducts a course on the history of the women's movement. What brought her to Anant was the challenge of looking at women's stories through the prism of space and built environment. Urvashi shared her thoughts on the need for open dialogues on diversity in educational institutions. 'It is important to make students think and ask questions'.

She lauds Anant's efforts to document disappearing practices and knowledge of indigenous people. 'It speaks to an educational institution taking steps to be inclusive and diverse in recording the histories of people on the margins of society. Women farmers and weavers from Ladakh have been invited to Anant to not only document their culture and tradition but also talk about their work for people to learn from. This helps bring focus to histories that are often hidden in writing which is mainly about men. To my heart as a feminist publisher and activist, this is really wonderful'.

Hailing from a community where education for women was not well supported or well received, Jasmine is in multiple leadership roles at Anant. An architect by training, Jasmine realised her true calling in education and has been teaching for the past thirteen years. She believes at Anant, she is seen for her work and ability and is not treated differently for being a woman. 'Anant fosters a strong sense of unity and resilience. During my time at Anant and as a part of the leadership, I have never been made to feel less important or excluded in any key decision making processes', she says.

She talks about how Anant's values are behind a diverse and inclusive campus. 'Anant's values are reflected in the culture it has set on campus and beyond. Students, faculty and staff are rooted in tradition while having a global mindset. Anant has grown over the years attracting people from a range of disciplines and ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds. People at Anant believe in being empathetic and aim to understand culture and community to tackle problems from multiple lenses', she adds.

Subhalaxmi is an Associate Professor with CuCE at Anant, where she conducts courses on entrepreneurship and economics. She also guides students and faculty members on their research endeavours.

Subhalaxmi has diversified her research from health economics to women entrepreneurship. She has secured multiple funded research projects, including one from the National Commission of Women on challenges faced by women entrepreneurs when scaling their business.

Speaking about her decision to join Anant, Subhalaxmi explains how design education prioritises practical and experiential learning over theory. 'With my focus shifting towards entrepreneurship, I wished to go beyond my comfort zone in theory to take on its practical application. Theoretical concepts need to be applied to solve real-world problems or create tangible outcomes. It is at Anant that students are pushed to spend time with communities to understand problems and then integrate theory to solve these problems through practical application'.



Kanan acknowledges the immense support she has received from both students and faculty in her mental health journey. She has also benefited from counselling services offered by Bloom Centre for Wellbeing at Anant.

'Given Anant's serious approach to design, it is not surprising that empathy is what drives everyone here. Both faculty and fellow students have been understanding and accommodating of struggles I have faced with my mental health, helping me through thick and thin. Trained professionals from Bloom have been there for me in times of distress, providing a contact point free from judgement. Anant has successfully created a safe space for people to speak up and it is evident that wellbeing is always a priority', she adds.

Shimoli sought a space where she could continue to pursue her passion for sketching while being around nature. It was equally important for her to be part of a community where she wouldn't be looked at or treated differently based on her appearance. At Anant, she believes she has found it all.

'Sketching has always brought me peace and is my go-to activity whenever the pressure gets too much. Fortunately, majoring in Space Design at Anant helped me practise my sketching while exploring elements of architecture. Also, the campus is well-designed and in sync with nature, providing ample options for green spaces. At Anant, I never felt I couldn't talk to people. I was hesitant initially to turn on my camera for classes during the pandemic but was always encouraged and pushed to not think of myself as anyone different'.

Shimoli has Alopecia, an autoimmune disease due to which she has been subject to social stigma from a very young age. She has received immense support from students and faculty at Anant to become more confident about her identity. 'People stare or keep asking questions. At Anant, this was never the case'.

A message from Shimoli to future Anant students: 'Relax, everything will be alright'.

Community Project: 2023 - Ongoing

Anant Fellowship in Sustainability and Built Environment in collaboration with Prabhat is working on designing for impact. Prabhat Education Foundation's programmes encompass a range of activities and services targeted to assist and support children with special needs, their families and the communities they belong to.

The project aims to develop more awareness about the special needs of differently abled children, find gaps in impact to create communication strategies for them and research the needs and behaviour of students to design spaces or products for affordable special education.

The first phase of the project developed an impact strategy based on the primary and secondary research on differently-abled students at the intersection of socio-economic marginalisation. It produced a documentary following which the project was extended for further designing for impact and community immersion for Anant's students.

Currently, students across the University are engaging with students from Prabhat to understand the need for universal design and the real-life gaps in access and design. The project also entails Prabhat's students engaging in design education and exploring possibilities of training at Anant.
