James Hegarty is a professor at Cardiff University, an Anant partner. As a SCoPE scholar and visiting faculty at Anant, he collaborated on research and engaged in scholarly activities to address the disconnect between ancient wisdom and modern problem-solving through storytelling.

Taking a solutionary approach to education, he has created the Katha Bija programme, which transforms the timeless narratives of the Ramayana and Mahabharata into tools for contemporary design thinking. These epics, rich with themes of love, loss and human experience, provide 'story seeds' for students to cultivate into their own creative solutions.

Dr Hegarty champions the idea that 'it's traditional to innovate', highlighting how these ancient stories have been reimagined over centuries. Through the Katha Bija exercise, students develop their narratives by integrating research, creativity and collaboration, creating solutions that bridge cultural understanding with modern challenges. His work demonstrates how storytelling can transform complex religious ideas into practical solutions, engaging communities through storytelling festivals.

Combined with comprehensive needbased financial aid covering up to 100% of tuition fees, this pioneering initiative makes quality design education accessible to talented students across linguistic and economic spectrums.

## **ADEPT**

The Anant Design Entrance and Proficiency Test (ADEPT) is a groundbreaking initiative that democratises access to design education in India. By offering the exam in five languages — English, Hindi, Gujarati, Bengali and Tamil — and with plans to expand this to include more Indian languages, we aim to ensure that linguistic ability does not act as a barrier, enabling talented individuals from different language backgrounds to access equal opportunities. This inclusive approach empowers students from diverse backgrounds to showcase their abilities and potential. ADEPT evaluates candidates' creative aptitude, logical reasoning and problem-solving skills, providing a fair assessment irrespective of their primary language.

Through this attempt, Anant seeks to cultivate a new generation of innovators equipped to address global challenges through design thinking. By breaking down language barriers, Anant positions itself as a leader in design education, making it accessible to a wider pool of talented individuals.

In the 2024-25 admission cycle, 43 applicants opted for ADEPT in various Indian languages

17 of these students have joined the Anant BDes Class of 2028.

Muhammad Hussain, a foundation year Bachelor of Design student at Anant emerges as a solutionary through his innovative approach to toy-making. This first-generation college student transforms simple materials into wondrous toys that spark joy in children's hearts.

His exceptional talent earned him the prestigious Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar in 2024 - India's highest recognition for young achievers. Among 1.9 million applicants, he stood out as one of just 19 winners. His craftsmanship also won him the Gold Prize at the 2022 National Art Festival, competing with 800 others and recognition from Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who accepted his handcrafted musical toy.

Now at Anant supported by full financial aid, this young solutionary explores ways to merge artificial intelligence with traditional toy making, reimagining how children learn and play.



## Building Myanmar's Future

## **Van Hlei Thang**

Anant Fellowship for Sustainability and Built Environment, 2024

Chin State, Myanmar

Growing up on a church campus in Myanmar's Chin State, one of South Asia's lesser developed regions, Van witnessed how economic disparities created invisible barriers, even in sacred spaces. These experiences shaped his vision as an architect committed to social impact.

The military coup in Myanmar disrupted his plans to develop affordable housing in Chin State. Still, Van redirected his efforts to helping displaced communities rebuild shelters, collaborating with informal groups in rural areas.

Now part of our flagship programme, the Anant Fellowship on 90% financial aid, Van is expanding his expertise beyond traditional architecture. He values the fellowship's multidisciplinary approach as vital for Myanmar's future reconstruction. "We have to build our nation from the ashes again," he reflects.

A solutionary at heart, Van integrates sustainable design, community engagement and social impact strategies. His work bridges immediate shelter needs and long-term development goals, aiming to empower Myanmar's most vulnerable communities.

Since its establishment in 2016, Anant has demonstrated remarkable growth and achievement, garnering international recognition. Her illustrations demonstrate a breakthrough in storytelling methodology, combining cultural authenticity with modern artistic expression. At Anant, this young solutionary is experimenting with mixed media techniques, combining traditional illustration with digital tools. Her current project documenting Chhara women's lives blends hand-drawn portraits with digital storytelling elements.

Kranti's vision of designing video games showcases her innovative approach to visual problem-solving, exploring how interactive digital art can create immersive storytelling experiences that resonate across cultural boundaries.

Her journey to Anant began during the pandemic with free online drawing classes. After conducting a portrait session with Anant faculty, she was invited to lead a workshop, which evolved into a comprehensive teaching role. She now leads courses in interaction design, design methods and analytical structural drawing.

As a solutionary bridging cultural heritage with modern technology, Irena is developing new curricula that blend traditional techniques with emerging technologies. At Anant's upcoming media lab, she focuses on virtual reality and non-destructive art restoration, making art conservation more accessible through innovative solutions.

At age 12, he learned to create intricate 'pasedi' fabrics under his father and grandfather's guidance.

Amit addresses the disconnect between traditional craftsmanship and modern design needs as a solutionary in Anant's Sustainable Fashion and Textile Design labs. He transforms ancestral techniques through experimentation with new materials and technology, creating carpets and stoles that honour tradition while meeting contemporary demands.

Working alongside professors and industry experts, Amit has evolved into an artisan and a teacher. His work, recently featured in Anant's Diwali gift boxes, demonstrates how traditional weaving can adapt to modern markets while preserving its essential character.

Tsetan plans to explore sustainable fashion strategies, focusing on practical, impactful solutions. Her journey reflects the essence of being a solutionary—embracing diverse perspectives and traditional practices to create meaningful change in the fashion industry.



# Innovating Solutions

'At Anant School for Climate Action, we believe diversity powers our climate solutions. Our students, from first-generation learners to seasoned professionals, bring perspectives from every corner of India and beyond. The youngest fellow in the Anant Fellowship for Climate Action cohort of 2025 is 17 years old, while the oldest is 48, coming from 9 different countries. In our Bachelor of Technology in Climate Change, the gender representation is balanced, with 45% male students and 55% female students. Through this programme, we are pioneering India's first undergraduate climate-focused programme, preparing students to tackle climate-related challenges with both technological expertise and diverse perspectives. The research centre Anant Centre for Sustainability and the Anant Climate Lab, both of which are part of the Anant School for Climate Action, strengthen this vision through comprehensive climate research and practical solutions.'

## Engineering Nature's Solutions

## **Riya Gupta**

**BTech in Climate Change** 

Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh

Riya Gupta is channelling her passion for sustainability into creating practical solutions for pressing environmental challenges. This young solutionary from Varanasi leads multiple innovative climate action projects.

Her flagship project, backed by a ₹ 2.5 lakh i-HUB grant, addresses a critical paradox in air purification. While traditional air purifiers clean our air, they eventually end up in landfills. **Riya's solution is a completely biodegradable moss filter air purifier that tackles air pollution without creating waste.** With support from MIT Solve, a partner of Anant School for Climate Action, her second project develops an algae-based carbon capture system that doubles as a biofuel producer. Her third innovation transforms discarded pomegranate peels into copper oxide nanoparticles for industrial wastewater treatment.

Outside the lab, Riya is an accomplished dancer who is now exploring aerial dance, bringing a creative perspective to her scientific work.



## Leading Creative Initiatives at Anant

#### **Ravice Rashid**

**Artist In Residence** 

Wathora, Kashmir

Ravice Rashid is an artist from Kashmir who uses theatre to bring attention to environmental crises in his homeland. On stage, he tells diverse stories from Dudh Ganga's (Milk River) pollution to Kashmir's vanishing forests, creating performances that stir communities into action.

Born into a family of musicians and theatre artists and the first in his family to graduate from University, Ravice carries forward his artistic legacy while fighting for Kashmir's environment. In times of turmoil, his theatre became a sanctuary where Kashmir's stories could still be told.

As an Artist in Residence at Anant, he has conducted a workshop on 'Role of Design in Theatre' and directed a cross-cultural production of the Ramayana for Diwali. #### **Aarambh Incubation Centre**

The incubation centre supports entrepreneurship and innovation at Anant National University. It provides mentorship and investor connections for new ventures. The Centre operates a Tinkering Lab to develop innovative solutions.

#### **Anant Centre for Documentation and Design of Crafts (ACDC)**

The Centre preserves and revitalises traditional Indian crafts through research and the Mind to Market approach. It documents artisanal techniques, facilitates designer partnerships and creates contemporary applications.

#### **Anant Centre for Sustainability (ACfS)**

This Centre operates as a 'think-do-teach' tank for sustainable development. It focuses on affordable housing and circular economy models. The Centre develops sustainable education campuses across India.

#### **Anant Centre for Visual Arts (ACVA)**

Rameshbhai, a bamboo artisan from Gujarat's Dabka village, transformed his ancestral craft through innovative solutions. Having learned bamboo crafting from his father to make traditional items like topla and topli, his journey took a new direction through Anant's Anushilp 'Artisan in Residence Programme', in collaboration with US-India Foundation, an Anant partner.

As a solutionary craftsman, Rameshbhai tackled the declining demand for traditional bamboo items that threatened his community's livelihoods and generational craft heritage. Through Anushilp, he gained access to modern tools and expert mentorship, enabling him to blend traditional techniques with contemporary design. This adaptation doubled his income and led to prestigious projects like creating bamboo gift boxes for the G20 summit.

He developed solutions for efficient production, sustainable sourcing and modern aesthetics while maintaining authenticity. Beyond personal success, Rameshbhai shares his knowledge with fellow artisans, showing how traditional crafts can evolve thoughtfully to meet contemporary needs.

After completing her bachelor's in political science from St Xavier's College, her passion for policy and human development took her to the Netherlands for a double master's programme - a degree in public policy from Maastricht University and human development from the United Nations University. In the Netherlands, Oleena worked with Dutch diplomats to develop integration policies for refugees from Palestine, Syria and Afghanistan, establishing her as a humanitarian solutionary.

At the Anant Fellowship for Built Environment, cohort 2021, Oleena applied her social science expertise to built environment challenges. During the Fellowship, she received both the Anant Fellow of the Year and the President's Academic Performance awards.
