



The Year at a Glance

Innovation remained the driving force for the year 2021–22. The university accelerated its mission of revolutionising the world through innovative design solutions with the launch of the Aarambh Incubation Centre. Supported by the Student Startup & Innovation Policy (SSIP), Government of Gujarat, and Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) - Kanpur, the centre, through their maiden project - Idea Contest, identified more than ten student projects and provided grant support to develop their innovations. The centre also set up a Tinkering lab to strengthen its research and entrepreneurship culture at AnantU.

The university has established Anant School for Climate Action to familiarise future solutionaries with climate studies and make meaningful contributions. Additionally, AnantU also started with new programmes, including a Bachelor of Visual Arts, executive programmes in Affordable Housing and Entrepreneurs in Residence and a new design specialisation - Moving Image. The university also successfully inducted the inaugural cohort of Sustainable Fashion and Textile Design students.







Campus and Infrastructure

The state-of-the-art award-winning campus, housed in the Sanskardham campus, Bopal, is equipped with collaborative classrooms, studio spaces and workshops for climatology, carpentry, metalworking and ceramics. The vibrant courtyard, picturesque lake, spacious amphitheater, and lush green landscape surrounding the main building add to the charm of the beautiful campus.

Students have access to flexible learning spaces for hands-on activities, makerspace and workshops, exhibition spaces and rejuvenation centres. They can avail of several sports facilities, including a gymnasium, volleyball court and cycling tracks.

The University offers modern and comfortable accommodation facilities for the students. The hostels can accommodate 328 students and is under CCTV surveillance for their safety and security. The hostel comprises Wi-Fi, a mess, a gym, common reading and play areas and an amphitheater. 4000 trees of varying kinds, such as Gulmohar, Mango, Asopalav, Banyan, Tamarind, Coconut, Almond, Guava and Indian Gooseberry & Blackberry, among others surround the main campus. It has also set up a sewage treatment plant which accumulates all the drainage water released from the campus and treats it to make the water reusable, making AnantU a truly sustainable campus.

















Users of the Makerspace can work on wood, plastics and other materials like plaster, clay and to a limited extent on metals. The digital manufacturing capability includes 3D printing, laser cutting and etching, as well as a full 8'x4 CNC routing. These and the electronics workbench equipped with a full set of Arduino boards and supported accessories and daughter boards with sensors and actuators make it possible to invent, create and tinker.

1. Official Launch of Aarambh Incubation Centre

The visit aimed to educate the students regarding the complete process of manufacturing- from casting to forming. They were also briefed about the machinery, QC and safety measures. The visit to these institutes gave them exposure to moulding machines, extruders, blow-moulding machines and Rotomoulding etc.

Sensitization sessions: Idea to Enterprise

A sensitization session was held for the entire student community on how technology can aid in converting ideas to real life projects, avenues to explore entrepreneurship and gain insights into marketing and managerial aspects required to gauge the potential of an idea. A session on IP sensitization was conducted to explain the various forms of IP and the importance of the same for innovators and entrepreneurs.

Learning Commons

The Library at Anant National University has been named into our Learning Commons. The aim of the Learning Commons is to provide an ultra-modern environment that encourages both, the creation and the dissemination of knowledge in all of our academic programs. The Learning Commons have been outfitted with state-of-the-art IT infrastructure and are backed by Radio Frequency Identification (RFID).

The Library is spread over an area of 680 square meters and includes an ultramodern reading space that can seat a total of 250 students, a cyberspace with the best computer technology available, and most importantly, an integrated information desk and self-check issue return kiosk with the ability to cater to any need of our readers. We also try to engage our students by holding a great variety of events, such as book launches, book discussion sessions, motivational lectures, documentary screenings, seminars, and so on. 

his is a comprehensive undergraduate degree programme that seeks to challenge today's physical, experiential and functional reality to create innovative and sustainable life. It aims at making designers futureready to cater to the requirements emerging from new realities driven by technological disruptions.

It offers a range of Major to make learning multidisciplinary, thus exposing the students to diverse perspectives. These courses offer students an opportunity to try various possibilities, pursue co-curricular interests, discover new passions and change their way of thinking and processing things.

Majors offered:

1. Communication Design

Communication Design is a creative design process, with a concept at its core and an intent to entertain or educate. Aided by textual and visual messaging, the communication design process enables intuitive learning and understanding of ideas. By controlling colour, type, movement, symbols and images, the



communication designer creates and manages the production of visuals designed to inform, educate, persuade and entertain the audience.

2. Sustainable Fashion and Textile Design

This programme draws from the fields of fashion, textile, technology and sustainability, to impart a unique and comprehensive understanding of conscious fashion and textile design. It explores processes, material, form, silhouette and communication based on environmental, social, cultural and economic imperatives. This programme aims to create solutionaries who will be tackling the problem of extensive resource depletion coupled with landfill overburdening caused by the textiles and fashion sector, through responsible dialogue, innovation and creation.

3. Interaction Design

This programme explores the user's interaction with products and services. It exposes and trains students to design and develop interactive digital products, environments, systems and services required to solve contemporary challenges. The programme sensitises students to user needs, instils logical creativity and crafts meaningful consumer experiences.

4. Product Design

Product Design is a strategic problem-solving process that drives innovation, builds business success, and leads to a better quality of life through innovative products, systems, services, and experiences. The programme promotes impact through design. It educates designers to not only solve today's problems but also propose new ways for the future.

5. Space Design

This studio-based, research-led practical design course, aims at nurturing space designers as critical thinkers, empathic human beings and innovative makers/ do-ers. It offers an array of courses that help designers offer simple, functional and aesthetically appealing solutions to problems related to space design.

6. Transdisciplinary Design

This programme exposes students to all the fields of design and choose courses from other design disciplines to enhance their learning. They choose their own path, selecting studios, theory, workshops, modules or electives across the disciplines. They are guided about designing their unique pathways. In their final year, students bring together diverse knowledge and integrate the spectrum.


6. Moving Image



Currently, the conceptualization process is in progress for the lake. Following delivery of detailed design, the designated plots along Bopal-Ghuma road for public open space will be also designed by the team as green, public space.

This cross-disciplinary studio culminated in the form of interactive installations designed and executed by our students and exhibited at the Abhivyakti city arts festival in Ahmedabad.
