5 Pathways For Mainstreaming Urban Climate Actions - A Discussion Paper

The paper identifies a set of actions where start-ups could support state and urban local bodies in providing solutions. Urban labs can be promoted with a combination of high-tech and low-tech solutions, which can be managed locally and simply. Since 2019, several steps have been taken to integrate climate change in the urban sector; however, more efforts are required to build local climate actions. Urban governance requires adequate legal and policy frameworks, as well as efficient institutional and administrative processes, to enable the government to respond to the needs of citizens in the context of climate change. The five thematic recommendations on Institutional Structure, Policies, Capacity Building, Financing and Innovation will help urban India to mainstream climate actions to the fullest. This is supplemented with an action plan, which provides a step-by-step approach for applying recommendations and phasing of sub-activities in the short, medium and long term.
